FROM MORNING PRAYER – PSALM 76(77)

"We are in difficulties on ever side, but never consumed" (2 Cor 4: 8)

In the day of distress I sought the Lord with outstretched arms.

I cry aloud to God, cry aloud to God that he may hear me.

In the day of my distress I sought the Lord. My hands were raised at night without ceasing; my soul refused to be consoled. I remembered my God and I groaned. I pondered and my spirit fainted.

You withheld sleep from my eyes. I was troubled, I could not speak. I thought of the days of long ago and remembered the years long past. At night I mused within my heart. I pondered and my spirit questioned.

"Will the Lord reject us for ever? Will he show us his favour no more? Has his love vanished for ever? Has his promise come to an end? Does God forget his mercy or in anger withhold his compassion?"

I said: "This is what causes my grief; that the way of the Most High has changed." I remember the deeds of the Lord, I remember your wonders of old, I muse on all your works and ponder your mighty deeds. In the day of distress I sought the Lord with outstretched arms.



FIRST READING OF THE DAY – ISAIAH 40: 4-9

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear.

For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle.



The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

My vindicator is here at hand. Does anyone start proceedings against me? Then let us go to court together. Who thinks he has a case against me? Let him approach me.

The Lord is coming to my help, who dare condemn me?

This is a hard reading but faces up to the reality that a disciple's life is not always easy or happy. It has many challenges. During this time of pandemic, some people are angry – very angry. Quite often, they cannot say what they are angry about – it is just too deep. They are angry with a virus – but know that does not make sense. They are angry at the massive disruption to their lives. They are angry with a God who lets this happen. And their anger is often directed at those trying to help – people who share their anger and utter dismay but who are trying to make sense of it and support others through it. The words that they try to say are faltering and can sound like platitudes– but always God is trying to speak through his people – those who will listen deeply and whose words come for that deep place of knowing God's unfailing love in the bleakest of times and places.

- Read the passage slowly as if hearing the words spoken through Isaiah being spoken directly to you.
- Which word or phrase seems to speak most deeply to you? Jot them down or repeat them several time to memorise them.
- How can learn to listen more deeply to God so that you develop a disciple's tongue to find those words that flow out to the wearied and the angry during these difficult and exhausting days?
- Use your word or phrase as a mantra as you go through the morning.

NOON – THE ANGELUS



The angel of the Lord declared unto Mary, and she conceived by the Holy Spirit. *Hail Mary...*

THE GOSPEL OF THE DAY - MATTHEW 26:14-25

One of the Twelve, the man called Judas Iscariot, went to the chief priests and said, 'What are you prepared to give me if I hand him over to you?' They paid him thirty silver pieces, and from that moment he looked for an opportunity to betray him. Now on the first day of Unleavened Bread the disciples came to Jesus to say, 'Where do you want us to make the preparations for you to eat the passover?' 'Go to so-and-so in the city' he replied 'and say to him, "The Master says: My time is near. It is at your house that I am keeping Passover with my disciples." 'The disciples did what Jesus told them and prepared the Passover.

When evening came he was at table with the twelve disciples. And while they were eating he said, 'I tell you solemnly, one of you is about to betray me.' They were greatly distressed and started asking him in turn, 'Not I, Lord, surely?' He answered, 'Someone who has dipped his hand into the dish with me, will betray me.

The Son of Man is going to his fate, as the scriptures say he will, but alas for that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! Better for that man if he had never been born!' Judas, who was to betray him, asked in his turn, 'Not I, Rabbi surely?' 'They are your own words' answered Jesus.

- Spend a few minutes pondering what is happening in this Gospel? Jesus knows that things are about to fall apart but the disciples are in denial. One has already acted but cannot admit it? Why is Judas even at the table?
- Even knowing what is to come, Jesus still marks the Passover. Even knowing that he has begun his betrayal, Judas comes to eat with the others. Even suspecting that when it comes to it, they will all go on to fail Jesus, the disciples maintain the routine.
 How are you trying to maintain a routine as life as we knew it seems to fall apart? How does this help? How does it hinder facing what we need to?
- How can we hold on to hope when much that we knew and treasured is taken from us?

REVIEW OF THE DAY

When have you been aware of God during the day? Which of God's words have carried you through today? Thank God for them. When you sensed that your work – your care of others – has felt like serving the Lord? When have you made selfish choices that have crushed or hurt others? Ask God for forgiveness and ideas on how to put things right.


