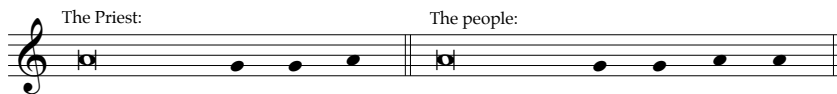
Greeting
